WOMEN'S CRICKET UPDATE

SOME GREAT RESULTS FROM OUR WOMEN'S AND GIRL'S TEAMS!

The Premier Reserve Women's team are the first University team to secure an ACA title this season. On 19th February the team beat Cornwall in the T20 final by a massive 102 runs.

University completely dominated the final. Batting first they posted 185-5 with MVP Stephanie Carr scoring an incredible 102 (off 57 balls)! Carr and Alex Hurley (18) put on 52 in the opening stand off just 31 balls. No 3 Alice Black then piled on a quick 42 (off 27 balls) to take the game beyond Cornwall who in the qualifying rounds only lost to University by 9 runs in a close encounter.

The University bowling attack was just too strong for a shattered Cornwall batting line-up and they finished at 83-7. Chief wicket takers for University were Gemma Lord (2-12) and Karis Benjamin (2-17).

Stephanie Carr ended the T20 competition as the top runs scorer with 252 runs (SR 154) and Karis Benjamin topped the bowling ladder with 9 wickets @ 7.8.

HAUGHEY CUP STAYS AT UNIVERSITY

Old Timers Day saw the University Girls U12s & Women's Premier Reserves (U21's) successfully defend the Haughey Cup against Cornwall 3-0.

The Haughey Cup was first played for eight years ago in 2004 and last season University were successful in this annual fixture against Cornwall for the very first time. On Sunday all three games went down to the wire with University prevailing in all three games.

The trophy was donated in 2004 by Barbara Haughey who has a close affiliation to both Clubs. At the time Barbara was the Club Manager at the University Club and in Auckland cricket circles she is widely credited with establishing cricket at the Cornwall Club for young girls. Today Cornwall boasts six girls or women's teams, more than any other Club in New Zealand. University has three teams.

Barbara was present on Sunday to present the trophy to the U21 Captain Stephanie Carr. Barbara said "that she did not really care who won the trophy each year as she has a foot in both camps but it was really pleasing to see the competitive spirit in all three games. Girls cricket is clearly alive and well in both camps".

It was only 12 years ago that University had the best Woman's club team in NZ - our "Old Girls" would be very pleased with Sunday's result!

This year the Club was represented by three teams in the Haughey Cup versus Cornwall, Under 12 Girls softball, Under 12 Girls hardball and Womens Premier Reserve.

University won each of the three Twenty20 matches played and subsequently retained the cup. A great effort. Well done girls!



OLD TIMERS DAY

University hosted its inaugural "Old Timers Day" on Sunday 27th February.

The day began with the girls teams defending successfully the Haughey Cup, (details above)

Feature Twenty20 games included the Annual Fingletoads versus AUCC Under 18 side who competed for the Harold Bennett Trophy. The Under 18's reclaimed the trophy from the Fingletoads. This was followed by the Presidents X1 versus a Vice Chancellors X1 with the Presidents X1 taking away the Centennial Match Balls on the day, see match details below.

THE 1977 NZ CLUB CHAMPION TEAM HONOURED ON OLD TIMERS DAY

Eight members from the 1977 University Premier team were present on Old Timers day - Sunday 27th February. The Club uses the occasion to celebrate the achievements of a team from the past and this year our National Club Championship winning side of 1977 were recognised for their outstanding achievement.

After finishing a disappointing 5th in the 1976-77 Auckland Premier competition, the team's one consolation that season was to win the right to represent Auckland in the National Club Championship played at Cornwall Park, where the national one day club championship is still played today.

University played Christchurch club Burnside in the Club Championship final. University bowled first after winning the toss on a grass wicket devoid of grass and moisture and dismissed Burnside for just 127 in an outstanding team bowling effort (Larry Sewell 0-22, John Carson 2-31, Warren Stott 3-24, Peter McDermott 2-15, and Neil Purdon 3-36). Ross Dykes also had an outstanding day behind the stumps picking up two stumpings and taking two catches!

In reply University struggled early on and at one stage were 34-5 before Greg Jones (40) and Larry Sewell (53no) put on 80 for the 6th wicket to steer the side home to a comfortable victory in the end to take out the Gillette Cup and the \$500 winners cheque. Larry Sewell's 53 not out was enough for him to take Man of the Match honours.

The match was televised live on national TV bringing fantastic profile for the Club. The 12 men who brought the national silverware back to the club were: Ross Dykes (c), Jim Riley, Peter Mathieson, Phil Haydon, John Wiltshire, John Carson, Greg Jones, Simon Joyce, Larry Sewell, Neil Purdon, Warren Stott & Peter McDermott.

The courses are not the be all and end all, but by understanding the game more you and your team, or son or daughter, will definitely enjoy the game a lot more.

To book the indoor nets go to www.terryjarviscentre.co.nz and select your day and time from within the bookings options on the left of the home page.

PCC members will receive the discounted rate by putting pcc in lower case in the discount option box.

You will then be asked for your credit card details to pay using the secure payment system.

Your email address is essential as a return email will provide

confirmation of your booking and the security access code. You will receive the confirmation email within 5 minutes of booking. You will then need to key the access code into the access pad at the centre's front door to gain entry. This same access code will also operate the lights on the panel in the reception area at the left of the stairs.

Bookings are for one hour on the hour and the lights will turn off at the completion of the hour.

Please ensure the door is closed properly on your departure.

The centre has 24 hour camera monitoring but we rely on all users to take care of this most valuable facility.
